

Clyne Valley path

A six mile traffic free ride up and down the Clyne Valley. (OS 1:50,000 sheet 159)

This is an easy ride suitable for families with children. It follows the old railway line between Blackpill and Dunvant (NCN Route 4). A challenge for children is to spot the three old railway stations!

There are three places adjacent to the path where you can park: Dunvant Car Park (GR 595939), The Railway Inn (GR 598924) or Blackpill (GR 619908). Parking is free at the first two but Pay and Display applies at Blackpill. Note that there is a gentle rise from Blackpill to Dunvant.

Starting at Dunvant the ride simply follows the path down to Blackpill and back up again. After a mile you reach the Railway Inn, a traditional pub with tables outside; just over a mile further on there is a pond on your right which you can walk round. You are now less than a mile from Blackpill. Across the cycle/pedestrian crossing here (called a *Toucan* crossing because two can cross) there is the beach and a short distance to your right a children's play area with a café and toilets.

Safety tips

- Before starting check that your bike is in working order.
- Give way to pedestrians and horses.
- Use your bell to warn pedestrians of your approach.
- Keep to the left to pass approaching cyclists.

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
